Credentials, Passes, & Admission

Each livestock exhibitor will be given one 4-day admission wristband to the Placer County Fair. Wristbands will be available to pick up during the receiving dates and times listed for each category. When entry forms are turned in, exhibitor can then purchase additional livestock admission wristbands for \$16. Wristbands must be worn during the entirety of the fair.

Carnival Bonus

When turning in entry forms, livestock exhibitors may purchase a 4-day carnival wristband for \$50 for unlimited carnival rides. This wristband is good for all open hours of the fair, Thursday through Sunday. These may be purchased at the time of entry only. The price of a carnival wristband will go up to \$80 at the fair.

Still Exhibit Entry

All market livestock exhibitors are **required** to enter at least one entry into the Still Exhibit department. Applications are due by Friday, May 29 at 6 p.m. Entries are free for all youth 18 and under. The age limit is 19 and under if an exhibitor is in 4-H.

How can I enter?

At the beginning of each department page is information relative to that competition. This information includes eligibility requirements, entry deadline, delivery/pick up information and judging schedule.

When is the entry deadline?

Entry forms & fees must be received by the fair office before 6 p.m. on Friday, May 22, 2020.

Where do I turn in my entry form and fees?

You are encouraged to enter online through our **ShoWorks Online** entry system or to bring the printed form directly to the @the Grounds administration office. You are also able to mail in the entry forms and fees but you will not receive a return receipt.

Forms and fees may be mailed immediately following the issuance of this handbook. Hand delivered forms will be accepted in the administration office during normal business hours from Monday through Friday 10 a.m. - 6 p.m. No forms or fees will be accepted after 6 p.m. on the entry deadline date. Postmarks are accepted! No entry will be accepted with a postmark later than Friday, May 22, 2020.

Livestock Categories

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Placer County Fair Livestock Rules

The Junior Livestock Auction will be held Sat, June 27 at 10 a.m. in the Livestock Pavilion.

Junior Market Animals and Replacement Females must be weighed in

on Wednesday, June 24, 2020 from 6-8 p.m.!

Official Rules

- 1. An official Placer County Fair ear tag/tattoo is required on all market animals from the time of weigh-in to the release of animals on Sunday, June 28. All other identification tags will be removed at the scales (with exception of Jr. Grand National or California State Fair ear tags and scrapie tags.)
- 2. An exhibitor may enter up to three (3) market animals (any combination of species) total at the Placer County Fair.
- 3. Each exhibitor will be allowed to sell only one (1) market entry regardless of species: One (1) Market Beef or one (1) Replacement Heifer, or one (1) Market Hog or one (1) Replacement Gilt, or one (1) Market Lamb or one (1) Replacement Ewe, or one (1) Market Goat or one (1) Replacement Doe, or one (1) pen of Rabbits or one (1) Single Fryer Rabbit, One (1) dozen Market Eggs. Animals eligible for the sale must be declared within one hour of the conclusion of the show. All declarations must be made to the Junior Livestock Office.
- 4. All Champions and Reserves must sell. Only in the instance that an exhibitor is awarded both a Grand and/or a Reserve Champion will an exhibitor be allowed to sell two (2) animals.
- 5. The Limit of one (1) market entry to be sold through the Junior Livestock Auction has the following Pen exceptions: Rabbits: One Entry to consist of three (3) Rabbits.
- 6. Only animals deemed worthy by the judge, and declared market ready/acceptable will be allowed to sell in the Junior Livestock Auction.
- 7. Market lambs must be slick shorn within 10 days of the opening day of the Fair.
- 8. Primary members are not eligible to sell.
- 9. All animals eligible for the sale must be shown as individuals in their respective classes and will be selected at the judge's discretion. Animals will be placed in sale order by official show clerks based upon the judge's direction.
- 10. All exhibitors are required to wear the appropriate uniform based on their organization (independent, FFA, or 4-H) for all shows and auctions. All clothing should be clean and free of stains.
 - FFA White pants, white collared shirt, closed toed shoes, FFA scarf or tie, FFA jacket.
 - 4-H White pants, white collared shirt, closed toed shoes, 4-H scarf or tie, and 4-H hat.
 - Independent White pants, white collared shirt, and closed toed shoes
- 11. All exhibitors of sale animals must be present in the official uniform when pictures are taken for buyer's photographs. This picture is a requirement for sale of the animal.
- 12. The Sale Order will be posted at the Livestock Entry Office. It is the exhibitor's responsibility to check this list immediately upon posting and report any changes to the Livestock Entry Office. Corrections must be made at the time posted by the Livestock Entry Office. You will have one hour after it's posted to find any mistakes. After that, once mistakes are fixed, the sale order will be FINAL. If the exhibitor does not declare their market animal for the Junior Livestock Auction, fair management will choose the higher placing animal and declare it for the exhibitor.
- 13. Animals must be owned and cared for by the exhibitor for the following minimum length of time prior to the Placer County Fair:

Placer County Fair Livestock Rules

Beef 150 days Sheep, Swine & Goats 60 days

- 14. Exhibitors must care for their animals until departure from the Fairgrounds or they will forfeit all awards, auction monies and eligibility at future Placer County Fairs. There is zero tolerance in regard to exhibitor and parent conduct. This includes mucking stalls and maintaining a clean stall and aisle at all times.
- 15. Any marking of sale animals required by Fairs & Expositions will be enforced.
- 16. All market animals sold will be charged a 7% commission and add-on 3% commission.
- 17. A substitute handler to sell the animal will be allowed only after approval from Placer County Fair Management. The exhibitor must present to Fair Management, a written request to have another eligible exhibitor sell their animal. The substitute exhibitor must appear in full uniform of his/her respective organization (4-H, FFA or Grange). This request must be provided to management 10 days prior to auction day.
- 18. The Junior Livestock Auction Committee will be responsible for shipping of all sale animals.
- 19. Official Weigh-masters will be provided. No Pre-Weighing of animals is permitted. If a weight is contested, re-weigh must be requested at the scale immediately. The animal in question will be removed from the scale, the scale will be re-balanced, and the animal will again be weighed. Under no circumstances shall the animal leave the scale area. Underweight market animals entered in a market class will automatically drop to a feeder class, overweight feeder animals may NOT move up to a market class, three (3) feeder entries (per specie) is allowed per exhibitor. If an animal does not make weight, no replacements are allowed.
- 20. There is to be no private scales on the grounds. Excessive exercise of a market animal for the purpose of weight reduction is forbidden on the Fairgrounds. Excessively wet animals will be disqualified by the weigh-master.
- 21. PAY WEIGHT LIMITS. There will be no top weights on the following species, and the top pay weights for sale purposes are as follows:

Beef = 1400 lbs.

Sheep = 150 lbs.

Goats $= 110 \, \text{lbs}$.

Maximum weight for all market hogs is 285 lbs. Minimum Weight is 220 lbs. Hogs weighing above 285 lbs. will be disqualified from market classes and the Junior Livestock Auction but may remain in Showmanship (State Rule VII,30).

- 22. Market Beef Exhibitors must furnish a Bill of Sale and/or official Brand Inspection form to the State Brand Inspector. A Brand Inspection or an out billing from an auction yard must be made out to the exhibitor, showing proof of 150 days ownership, or a signed statement declaring the animal was bred and raised by the exhibitor.
- 23. All sale animals, except for poultry and rabbits, must have been pre-weighed at the designated pre-weigh in dates. Due to COVID-19 and the "Stay at Home" Order in place by the Governor, the pre-weigh in for sheep, meat goats, and swine has been canceled. Pre-registration is still required. Please contact Placer County Fair Management for information on how to pre-register your animals.
- 24. Sheep Tail Docking To qualify for exhibit after December 31, 2002, market lambs must be docked such that the tail (dock) is healed and can be lifted from the exterior. Lambs that have no dock will not be eligible. Breeding animals born before January 1, 2002 are exempt. (Refer to State Rule IXA.)
- 25. All auction animals must go to the designated processing plant as determined by the Junior

Placer County Fair Livestock Rules

Livestock Auction Committee. Market steers and Market Lambs will go to the designated processing plant to be eligible for the carcass contest. The Junior Livestock Auction is a Terminal Sale for all Market Animals with the exception of Replacement Females. Small animals processed at Riella Farms and returned to Roseville Meats or Longhorn for pickup.

- 26. Sellers of market lambs and market goats are financially responsible for animals which are rejected at the processing center due to the presence of scrapie.
- 27. Any foul, abusive language and/or physical abuse used toward any Fair Personnel, Weigh-master, Auction Committee Member, Judge, etc. by exhibitors or parents may result in the immediate expulsion of the violators and their animals from the Fairgrounds for the duration of the Fair. This is a ZERO TOLERANCE policy.
- 28. Exhibitors, Leaders, Advisors and Parents are required to sign an adult code of conduct form. Anyone found in violation of rules or in practices deemed unethical or inimical with the Placer County Fair shall be penalized by forfeiture of premiums awarded and/or privileges as may be deemed appropriate to the circumstances, including ineligibility to participate at future Placer County Fairs and/or Junior Livestock Auctions.
- 29. Condition of Sale Animals: Only natural colored paint is to be allowed (beef). No other paint or decorations on animals is allowed. All sale animals must be in show-groom condition when entering the sale ring, or the animal will be disqualified from the Junior Livestock Auction.
- 30. No artificial hair-like substance or coloring changes will be permitted. No icing, slapping, drenching or muzzling will be permitted. All animals are subject to inspection by the official Fair veterinarian at all times. All animals will be inspected prior to entering the ring.
- 31. The Placer County Fair requires exhibitors of all market animals to complete a Medication Declaration Form for each animal brought to the scale for official weigh-in.
- 32. Premiums will only be offered for the top animals entered in their respective Futurity Class. Subclass may be determined by Fair Management, but premiums will only be for overall.
- 33. Exhibitors will not be allowed to ask the person who buys their animal to give or sell it back to the exhibitor. Exhibitors may not offer to trade another animal that was not sold in the auction to the buyer for the sale animal.
- 34. Sale Order for the 2020 Junior Livestock Auction will be done on a rotational basis as follows:

 All Animals will be sold by Specie starting with Champions and Reserve Champions, species will not be split in half.
 - All Small Animals will be sold by the Lot not by the pound Sale Order will rotate among species each year and will be determined by the Junior Livestock Auction Committee
- 35. Failure to observe the Junior Livestock Auction Rules may result in the animal being excluded from the sale.
- 36. In the event that an exhibitor receives an overpayment in premium or sale monies, the exhibitor is responsible for returning the overpayment to the Placer County Fair. Failure to do so may result in forfeiture of eligibility at future Placer County Fairs.
- 37. Checks for the sale animals will be available at the Placer County Fair Administration Office beginning Friday, July 24, 2020, between the hours of 10 a.m. to 4 p.m., Monday through Friday. Exhibitors must present a "Thank You" letter for their buyer to the Fair office, in a stamped, sealed envelope.
- 38. No generators will be allowed on the fairgrounds as per Cal Fire new rules. Generators found on the grounds will be removed immediately.

Adult Code of Conduct

As the parent, quardian, leader or advisor of an animal exhibitor in the Placer County Fair:

I believe my child should demonstrate his or her own ability, knowledge, and skill as a feeder, fitter and show person of a show animal. I understand that adults may NOT participate in my child's duty of washing, grooming, fitting, handling, or showing of his or her animal while at the fair.

I will ensure that my child follows the competition rules, and does not use abusive, questionable or unethical techniques in the feeding, caring, fitting, or showing of any animals. I will ensure that my child does not resort to fraudulent, illegal or deceptive practices while fitting or preparing the animal for show and will follow withdrawal protocol.

I have read and understand all of the rules and regulations found in the Livestock Handbook.

I realize that my child is responsible for:

- The proper care and humane treatment of animals before, during, and after exhibition and sale.
- The production of wholesome food when the exhibit animal is designated for market.

I will conduct myself at all times to be a credit to my child's organization, chapter, club, school, community, and family. I will follow proper procedures and chain of command if there is a conflict. I will not post negative comments or conflict on social media.

I am aware that **responsible alcohol use** is allowed on the fairgrounds and I will limit my use of alcohol so that I set a proper example for my child and the children of others around me. I shall ensure that other adults are equally responsible in the use of alcohol around my child. I shall not use any drugs that are considered illegal at the federal, state or local level while on the fairgrounds.

I understand that direct criticism or interference with the judge, fair or livestock show management, other exhibitors, breed representatives, or show officials before, during, or after the competitive event is prohibited. In the furtherance of their official duty, all judges, fair and livestock show management, or other show officials shall be treated with courtesy, cooperation, and respect. I will not allow any person connected with my child's project to direct abusive or threatening conduct toward any show official. Protest rules can be found in the State Rules for California fairs at www.cdfs.ca.gov/fe.

I understand and agree that if I, my child, my child's supervisor or leader or any other adult or minor connected with my child's project or animal(s) break the rules, I will accept the final decision of the Placer County Fair Management regarding the disqualification of my child and or the animal, the loss of prizes, the forfeiture of auction participation, loss of future eligibility, and forfeiture of any monetary award(s).

I understand that my minor child will not stay overnight @the Grounds without their parent or guardian present.

I accept that these entries are subject to the rules and regulations as published in the official Livestock Handbook. I further declare that all statements made in connection with my child's entries are true.

I will remember that children participate to have fun and that the competition is for the benefit of youth, not adults.

The JLA and Fair Management hire quality judges. Score cards are used as a tool by judges. However, all judging is subjective. It is that person's opinion that day. Market readiness is determined by the judge.

BEEF:

- Market Ready Market Beef projected to have sufficient fat deposition to meet the marbling specifications for USDA Prime or Choice or Select + quality grades

- If the first-place winner in any species declines, the second place winner may compete.
- The entrant with the highest total score will receive the Master Showmanship Award.
- Judges must be adults.
- Master showmanship winners may not show their own animal.
- Large Animal Master Showmanship to be held on Sunday, June 28 beginning in the Swine Show Ring #2 and moving to Show Ring #1. All Master Showmanship Exhibitors are required to check in at Show Ring #1 at 8:30 a.m.

- Scoring will be based on a point system, the junior exhibitor's points will come from their regular showmanship class, adding the parents score from the family showmanship. 1st place= 20 points, 2nd place= 18 points, 3rd place= 16 points, 4th place = 14 points, 5th place = 12 points, 6th place = 10 points and participation = 5 points.
- Parents to show their junior exhibitor's animal.

Ties will be broken by the Exhibitor entering the most animals in that specie.

All exhibits will be inspected daily and will be scored on the condition and appearance of the animals, condition of the stalls, pens and aisles, neatness and orderliness of the areas used for tack and equipment, and use of decorations and educational displays.

SPECIAL NOTE: Club or Chapter sign must be in clear view or no points will be awarded. The following scorecard will be used:
