Junior Livestock Auction

The Junior Livestock Auction of the Placer County Fair has been developed to educate the exhibitors in livestock marketing. This sale is made up of market animals that have been shown in the 4-H and FFA market show. These animals are owned, raised, fed, and shown by the young people in these organizations. They have been judged by knowledgeable people and placed according to market quality into sale order. By supporting this junior livestock auction, you are contributing to the education of today's youth, the citizens of tomorrow.

HOW THE AUCTION WORKS

Upon arrival, please register at the sale ring to receive your buyer's number, sale order and sale instructions. As each animal comes into the ring, the auctioneer will ask for bids per pound. If you wish to bid on the animal, show your number. Whether you buy the animal or not, your bidding will help the sale. If you need help bidding, ask one of the ring assistants for help. The highest bidder gets the animal.

How Custom Processing Works:

If you buy a 250 lb. Hog for \$5.50 per pound:

Sale Price= \$1375.00 Cut and Wrap Fee= \$265.00 Your Contribution= \$1640.00

How Resale Works:

If you buy a 250lb. hog for \$5.50 per pound:

Sale Price= \$1375.00

Approx. Market Value= \$.50 per pound

Market Value= \$ 125.00 Your Contribution= \$1250.00

WHAT YOU GET WHEN YOU BUY

If you elect to use the popular cut and wrap option, these are examples of what you could receive trimmed and packaged (numbers are approximate).

The cost of a 4-H or FFA animal project is
